April is "Environmental Month"



Hello Rotary members, April is going to be a very important month for you all. After the presidents-elect training seminar held on March 11, now it is time for clubs to prepare for the 2024-25 year with the policies of RI President-elect Stephanie A. Urchick and Governor-elect Chie Ito in mind. I would like to ask you to review the activities of the 2023-24 year to plan for the new year and promote Grow Rotary.

April is "Environmental Month", one of the areas of focus as determined by the RI Board of Directors in October 2022. It is a month to support activities that enhance the conservation and protection of natural resources, improve environmental sustainability, and promote harmony between people and the environment. We hope that this will be a month to reflect on what we can do now for the future.

Former RI President Barry Rassin said, "We have to look at the world as a whole and how we can make it a better place. If we're losing countries due to sea level changes, if stronger storms are disrupting water supplies or destroying people's livelihoods, that's more people who are going to be disadvantaged. So caring about the environment goes toward our ultimate mission, and we should give it the importance it deserves. As a humanitarian organization, we're obligated to talk about it. We need to have the conversation."

Taylor Cass Talbot, a 2011-13 peace fellow at Tokyo's International Christian University, added, " I fear there are many sources of climate change that we don't yet understand. For example, recent research shows that plastic in the environment emits methane. If this is the case, we may be very far from a viable plan to reduce the impact of climate change. We are so bombarded by environmental problems that we are creating siloed solutions. For example, many of the urgent responses to ocean plastics include the establishment of incineration facilities, which exacerbates both climate change and wealth disparity. We must think of these issues holistically, and we must listen to the voices of marginalized people, who are suffering the worst effects of climate change." Climate change threatens to spark conflict by further exacerbating poverty around the world.

First, let us as Rotary members pay attention to environmental issues and do what we can in our clubs and on our own.

This month, I would like to share with you another Paul Harris quote.

"Let us keep our hearts strong, enthusiasm fresh, hope high. As long as we keep imbued with this spirit, Rotary can never die."
